- There are over 400 million Facebook users.




How to Sign up















Privacy

4. What your friends can share about you

What your friends can share about you through applications and websites
When your friend visits a Facebook Platform application or website, they may want to share certain information to make the experience more social. For example, a greeting card application may use your birthday information to prompt your friend to send a card.
If your friend uses an application or website that you do not use, you can control certain types of information the application can access. Please note that applications will be able to access your Name, Profile Picture, Gender, as well as any information that is visible to Everyone. They will also be able to access your Connections, except the Connections noted with an asterisk below. In those cases, although the information is considered a Connection, you can control whether an application can access it.



Control how select partners can personalize their features with my public information when I first arrive on their websites






If this is checked, third party applications can adjust their ad offerings based on what you post to Facebook.





Manage Notifications

It's a good idea to get a notification when you have been tagged in a photo, video, or someone writes on your wall. The rest are your choice. If they are all checked, you will receive many emails.





I'm here now. What do I do?

Add friends

Use the Search box to look for friends on FB.
 You are given the choice to send the request or send only a message, or both.

Respond to friend requests

- You decide whether or not you confirm or ignore the request.
- You can also block people if you don't want someone to find you.



I'm here now. What do I do?


- Write a status update (post)
- Comment on a friend's status update, photo, link, or video
- "Like" a friend's status update, photo, link or video
- Write on a friend's wall
 - Be careful that you don't write your own status update on a friend's wall.
 - Click on Facebook in upper left to return to your home page.




Uploading Photos

- You can upload a photo within a status update OR
- You can create a photo album OR
- You can upload from your phone
- Be sure to check privacy settings
- Don't upload photos unless you know it is okay with the people in the photos. Especially children.
- You can choose to "tag" your photos or let others do that.












Removing Friends' Game Updates from your News Feed



You can hide your friend's game notifications or all notifications from that game. You can also click here to delete them from your notification list.





Frequently asked questions

What if I want to delete something I wrote?

Any comment you make has a delete option under it.

How do I delete something on my Wall?

Hold your mouse on the right side of the item and you will see a "Remove " option.

What if I don't want to be someone's friend?

You click "Ignore". You have to decide whether you want to "friend" everyone who asks you.

What is Private and what is Public?

Anything on your Wall or the Info section of your Profile is public. You set the options to "only friends", "friends of friends" or "everyone".

In addition, every group you "join" or "like" will be recorded on your wall, unless you change the settings.

What is "Wall to Wall?"

That is a conversation between you and another friend. If you both have mutual friends, they will see this conversation unless you change the settings.



Frequently Asked Questions (cont.)

Why did "Become a Fan" change to "Like"?

Facebook: "We believe this change offers you a more light-weight and standard way to connect with people, things and topics in which you are interested."

 Is there a difference between "liking" something a friend posts and liking a page?

Yes. When you click "Like" on a Page, you are making a connection to that Page. The Page will be displayed in your profile, and in turn, you will be displayed on the Page as a person who likes that Page. The Page will also be able to post content into your News Feed. When you "like" something a friend posts, it is only associated with that post.
