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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER
16	STATEWIDE BROADBAND NETWORK
17	A. The chief information officer shall establish
18	and maintain a statewide broadband network and apply for
19	reimbursements from the federal universal service fund pursuant
20	to Section 254 of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996,
21	47 U.S.C. 254, as such section existed on January 1, 2006, on
22	behalf of state agencies, political subdivisions and
23	educational institutions that request to be included in the
24	network.
25	B. The chief information officer, in partnership

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1 with the public education department, the higher education 2 department, political subdivisions and state universities and other educational institutions, shall develop and maintain a 3 statewide, multipurpose, high-capacity, scalable 4 telecommunications and broadband network. 5 The network shall consist of contractual arrangements with providers to meet the 6 7 demand of state agencies, political subdivisions and educational institutions. The network shall provide access to 8 9 a reliable and affordable infrastructure capable of carrying a spectrum of services and applications, including distance 10 education, across the state. The chief information officer 11 12 shall provide access on a voluntary basis to each school district, each community college, each state college and each 13 14 four-year state university at the earliest feasible date. Access may be provided through educational service units or 15 other aggregation points. The chief information officer shall 16 aggregate demand for those state agencies and educational 17 18 institutions choosing to participate and shall reduce costs for participants whenever feasible. The chief information officer 19 20 shall establish a cost structure based on actual costs, including necessary administrative expenses, but not including 21 administrative travel or conference expenses, and shall charge 22 participants according to such cost structure. 23

C. The chief information officer shall adopt technical standards for connection to the statewide broadband .204762.1

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
