Senior Chris Weisker had arranged the song, "Schadenfreude" from the musical "Avenue Q" and directed the band, earning a standing ovation from the band and audience alike.

Director Fred Lange took time to review each senior's plans for next year, obviously proud of their accomplishments in music and beyond. It seems there will be a community of DHS band alums at UC Berkeley and Cal Poly SLO alike next year.

The combined band took the stage for the night's finale with music from Disney's "The Lion King," bringing back memories from their March trip to Disneyland.



Essential Elements for Leadership

What makes a leader? Thirtythree of our band students can better answer that question after a fast-paced workshop with Tim

Lautzenheiser on April 17th. The students were on their toes to catch the fast delivery and infectious laugh of this charismatic speaker who challenged the students to grow beyond thinking in terms of "I/me" to "we/us." Cooperative games involving finger snapping or communicating without words reinforced the messages of helping all members of your team (or band) because the group doesn't succeed unless everyone succeeds. Dr. Tim encouraged the

students to go beyond average expectations saying, "You don't go through law school at *mezzo forte.*" The focused, 3-hour session flew by leaving the students more energetic and alert, and perhaps with the lasting thought, "It's not what you can do, or you would do, it's what you do do."

Dr. Tim is both leadership speaker and a music advocate and author. He is the lead author of the elementary band books used in our elementary and junior high schools, <u>Essential Elements</u>. Summary Minutes for April 5, 2007

Steve Williams opened the meeting at 7:30 pm. Motion passed to approve the Summary Minutes for the March 8, 2007 Band Boosters' meeting as published in the April newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Dennis Edgerley reported the following financials as of March 31, 2007. March cash flow income: \$37,326. March cash flow expenses: \$26,930. Student Accounts: \$855. Chaperone Accounts: \$132. IPAB Facilities account: \$4,359. Music Program account: \$3,015. Band Boosters account: \$19,121. Dennis explained the IPAB Facilities Account includes a \$3,600 reimbursement from the UC Davis Engineering Department for the Director's Lift project which could not be completed.

Band Booster's Business: Steve Williams asked for comments on a proposal to invite the parents of 9th grade band students to attend the May 10th Band Boosters' meeting. The meeting would be much less formal than the usual monthly meeting and structured to inform the incoming Band parents how they can become active volunteers in the Band Boosters. A special invitation would be posted on each junior high school's listserv. The proposal was enthusiastically supported by all. Bernadette announced that a student, Mike Sullivan, has agreed to be the Web Master for the Band Boosters' web site.

Band Director's Report: Mr. Lange reported that the Symphonic Band and Jazz Band auditions went very well. He is very pleased at the high quality of the incoming junior high school students' musical skills. He also expressed his appreciation for the outstanding support provided by two band students, China Swanson and Chris Weisker. He noted that the band class schedule may change next year. He also reported that the band program may not be required to play at the DHS graduation ceremony on June 15th; the school is considering the use of recorded music. The Capital Jazz Project concert is scheduled for April 20. The DHS Jazz Band is expected to play 3 songs as part of the concert. On April 17 he has arranged for a special workshop which will be conducted by Tim Lotzenheiser. Attendance will be largely limited to sophomore and junior band members. Mr. Lange will make arrangements for selected students to be excused from class to attend this workshop. Mr. Lange reported that the DHS Jazz Band took 1st place at the Fullerton Jazz Festival. The combined bands will perform at the Picnic and Pops Concert in the Park on May 30th in Davis Central Park. There will be a Jazz Combo concert on June 2 and a Jazz Ensemble concert on June 9.

Fundraisers: Mary Kay Williams reported that she needed two sophomore or junior students to assist with the UC Davis Picnic Day parking fundraiser on April 14. Amelia Triest informed the Band Boosters that the E Scrip organization was lagging in its monthly reports. She plans to contact the junior high school scrip coordinators to see if someone would like to assume this job next year.

Band Trips: Guidance was requested on how to handle the Disneyland Band trip documents, such as the Student Permission Forms, which contained confidential or personal information. Everyone agreed the documents are to be shredded and not retained.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
