Aaah, fall is in the air. And if we are talking football we are talking PEP BAND!

The Pep Band, led by Ana Ebrahimi entertained the crowd at the two recent football games. Over 100 students participated in each of these great events, including many of the sophomores from the **Concert Band**. Pep Band is almost entirely run by the students, all that I do is take roll and unlock the room for them to get their instruments. Students are responsible for almost everything the public sees and hears. The nicest part of this whole experience is that many of the students found their participation to be one of the most enjoyable times they had ever had in a band. Keep up the great work, students!

All students are reminded that participation in Pep Band at football games gets 50 credit points toward the 200 needed to get an A in the class. There has been a small change in the requirements for Homecoming. We will still participate in the parade in the afternoon and that will be REQUIRED (minus 100 points if the students do not participate), but the Homecoming Football Game will no longer be required. Naturally, students involved in another school-sponsored event (such as a Cross Country meet) would be excused from participating with no penalty.

In the classes, we have been preparing for chair auditions. By the time you read this, all will have been done. There have been some surprises in the Concert and Symphonic Bands, although most of the results were expected. In many instances the work has been good but there is a lot of skill-building to be done

in the Concert Band. Either these students did not take the work seriously, or they were not prepared for the demands of High School work. This might be time for your student to seek private tutoring (lessons) so they can develop the skills needed to advance.

So, what's coming up? More Pep Band October 12 and 26 that's for sure, but now we need to prepare for the **Outreach Concerts**!

In the district, we feel the need for the elementary students to see what life is like in the High School, so we open our doors and have a joint concert with the Continuing Bands students at the 8 elementary school sites. These events will be held in the IPA Theater. The 6th Graders perform a few selections and the DHS group performs a few selections, and then we get the groups together and play some songs in a massed band. This is a great thrill for the elementary students! In addition to all this music we will present some information to the elementary students and parents on how to prepare their child for a great high school experience. The public is invited (meaning mostly the elementary parents) and you might take this opportunity to see how great the DHS students sound!

The DHS students involved will be chosen from the highest chairs of the Symphonic, Concert, and Jazz Bands (based on audition scores and a balanced instrumentation.) There will be 2 rehearsals for this "elite" group (October 11 and 15) and 2 performances (October 16 and 18) in the IPA Theater. Students must be available for all 4 of these services in order to participate.

Sophomore Parents please note: your band student is growing up. The close family times you experienced just a few years ago will be fewer and fewer as your student matures in his/her high school experience. The band program is one place where you can still do things together! The students need your help in the area of fundraising. When you help out, you become a member of the band. The result is a closer family and great feeling for you. Don't miss out on this, which may be your last opportunity to experience some great times — together!

Suitable for a concert... Dress Blacks

The Concert and Symphonic Bands wear "Dress Blacks" as follows:

Men: Tux, or black suit, or black coat and black slacks, white shirt, black bow tie, black sox, and

nice black shoes. Sport shoes are not acceptable.

Women: Black dress, or black top and black skirt, or black top with black slacks. The dresses and tops

must have sleeves! All slacks must be slacks - not jeans nor tight-fitting pants. If the skirt is short (no shorter than 2" above the knee), you must wear black tights with black shoes.

1. Men, if your suit/tux/coat from last year does not fit anymore, how about donating it to DHS Bands for use by smaller students?

2. Parents, don't let your student talk you into an expensive purchase. Many times a black coat can be purchased at thrift stores for very little.

3. Women, all dresses must be totally black (no white ruffles or collars, etc.) If you intend purchase a new dress this year make it all black! Furthermore, last year I was concerned about the propriety of some of dress lengths. Let's be sensible this year -- no shorter than 2 inches above the knee, max. Flip-flops are not considered dress shoes.

Band Boosters Fundraiser Car Washes Coming in October!

It's time for you and your band students to set aside the Saturday mornings of October 13, 20, and 27 for the planet's most fun fundraiser car washes. From 8am to noon we'll be in the DJUSD district office parking lot (across from the Farmers Market) doing our part to beautify Davis by transforming dirty cars and trucks into spotless gems.

Each week we'll need about four parents (each taking a two hour shift) and a crowd of band students to make this work. Students who work will not only have a great time (washing cars, dancing, singing, and eating delicious snacks) but also will earn significant amounts of money that will be applied towards their Vancouver band trip accounts. Last year we raised a total of over \$2500 and this year our goal will be to hit the \$3000 mark. Next steps?

- 1. Effective immediately, park your cars outdoors under sappy trees and bird nests and encourage your neighbors to do the same. Resist the urge to wash them at all costs.
- 2. Sign up to be a parent volunteer (so that you can show the kids how to wash a car right!)
- 3. Volunteer to bring snacks and drinks for the hungry masses.
- 4. Plant a seed in your student's mind that there is no higher calling than working at the car wash. They will be solicited to sign up for a two or four hour shift in band class a few days before each of the Saturdays.
- 5. On Saturday 10/13, 10/20, and 10/27 make sure that you and your neighbors and friends bring their cars in for a bath AND be prepared to be big tippers. Remember, the DHS Band Boosters is a nonprofit organization so a healthy portion of your donation is tax deductible (see your accountant for details!).

Band Booster Meeting Minutes

September 12, 2007, 7:30 PM

IPAB

The first meeting of the year began with a welcome by band director, Fred Lange. He described the structure of the band classes and acknowledged the vital function of the band boosters to support the excellent bands at Davis High School.

Last year's co-president, Peter Matlock spoke to the purpose of the band boosters, and the lasting importance of the band trips to the students. Since the bands receive only about \$700 for program costs outside of instructional time, the boosters are necessary for funding trips, instrument purchase and repair, music purchase and other costs to maintain a high-enrichment program. In addition, the boosters provide logistical support for trips and performances. The boosters provide an avenue to make the trips more affordable to all students and to see that no student is excluded from participating due to financial needs.

The slate of officers for 2007-2008 was introduced: Mike Choy, president; Peter Matlock, vice president and jazz band liason; and Rick Hoover, treasurer. (Secretary position is vacant.) After leaving the room, the officers were elected unanimously.

President Mike Choy addressed the importance of volunteering, that we have immediate needs at the coordinator positions: fundraising, rent-a-band, wine tasting and scrip. Other vacancies: website, publicity, concert committee, pep band liason, coordinators and chaperones for the trip. Booster volunteers then had a minute to describe their area and what they needed from the group. These included: Susan Hulsizer, newsletter editor; Simone Kueltz, newsletter distribution; Joyce Hamaguchi, listsery coordinator; Dahlia Haberman,

concert committee; Lori Lovett, concert CD, video and DVD; Chris Voss, concert setup/takedown; Sarah Davis, Victoria trip; Entertainment Book; Janet Matlock; John Chuck and Michael O'Brien, car wash; Luisa Nye, rummage sale; Barbara Duffy, Play-a-thon; Randy Chin and Mike Coleman, Coconut Grove; Joyce Hamaguchi and Lisa Yamauchi, direct donation; and Lesli Chuck and Lisa Yamauchi, Jazz Artist Festival. Forms for volunteering opportunities were distributed, which are to be turned in to Peter Matlock.

Mike Choy then requested approval of \$4000 to Mr. Lange for the purchase of sheet music and instruments. Approved unanimously by the boosters. Meeting was adjourned.

(Note: due to various scheduling conflicts on the 12th, an alternate informational meeting was held by Mike Choy on the 11th for parents who could not attend on the 12th.)
