November marks the beginning of our concert season with the DHS bands, and we have a pair of them for you this month.

On Tuesday, **November 13** the DHS Symphonic Band will present "**Through The Eyes Of A Child**" a themed concert dealing with memories of childhood. Starting with "A Day At The Carnival," to "A Time To Dance," and ending with "Circus Franticus" this concert will prompt many nostalgic feelings in those who attend. Your students have been changed by some of the emotions presented in these works and I'm sure you will want to share this experience.

As an added attraction we will be honoring the new Superintendent of our school district, Dr. James Hammond. I have asked him to take a few moments to speak to the audience that evening. This is an event you won't want to miss.

Three days later, on **November 16**, our DHS Jazz Band will present their annual "**Jazz Extravaganza**." This concert has been an annual pre-Thanksgiving treat for over 20 years. The group has been working hard this year and is now ready for their first major performance.

As an added attraction, we will have a special **guest artist** join our band for this performance. **Patrick Langham**, professional Alto Saxophonist, has been a faculty member of the prestigious Dave Brubeck Institute for Jazz Education centered at the University of the Pacific in Stockton. We have some great selections that will feature his talents with our band including works by the amazing Oliver Nelson.

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You may say, "But, Mr. Lange, I don't like jazz..." Well, come anyway! I can promise you that once you attend one of these performances we will change your mind. The energy that these students put out for their audience is tremendous.

Both of these concerts will be held in the DHS IPAB Theater. The starting time is 7:30 p.m. and the suggested donation is \$7.00 General; \$6.00 for Students and Seniors.

On Thursday, **December 20** we will present our annual "**Winter Rhapsody**" concert featuring the Concert Band in its first major performance, the Symphonic Band with student soloist, **Andy Voss**, and a few selections by the combined forces of the Concert, Symphonic, and any Jazz members that want to participate. **Rehearsals** for these concerts (outside of regular class meetings) are listed in the calendar this newsletter. Please take a moment to put them on your calendar.

As October ends, so does football season. This year we have had a tremendous time with our DHS Pep Band thanks to the leadership of Ana Ebrahimi. A total of 67 students and numerous parents participated in this year's fundraiser car washes and raised a total of \$2,288 for the Victoria band trip. We were fortunate to enjoy three sunny Saturdays in October. Every week an enthusiastic crew fought off nature's call to sleep in and showed up bright and early eager to rid our town of dirty cars, SUVs, vans, and trucks. Customers were lured into the 5th & B parking lot by colorful blue and white balloons, pretty signs, and student barkers who kindly informed those passing by just how much their vehicles needed a bath. Our guests were treated to a thorough vacuum job; a sudsy wash that included cleaning hard to reach rooftops and greasy wheels; and a world class final detailing station that featured windows washed inside and out.

It was inspirational to see how hard both students and parents worked to make these car washes both fun and successful. Ho, Ho Holiday Rent-A-Band is coming!



The Rent-A-Band fundraiser has been a fixture of the DHS bands for over 25 years! People throughout Davis have hired small groups of students to provide holiday entertainment at all sorts of gatherings. These student groups provide the musical "cheer" and reap financial rewards for their efforts.

All DHS band students who attend at least two rehearsals and return permission slips prior to their first gig are eligible to participate. Student rehearsals are scheduled for one and a half hours, from 2:30 to 4 p.m., on November 14, 15, and 28.

Only one permission slip is needed to participate in any or all Rent-A-Band performances. As gigs are ordered by the public, Nancy and Lon Hatamiya (Rent-A-Band parent co-chairs) will post sign-up sheets with the date and time for each gig on the bulletin board in the band room. Students may sign up for as many gigs as they want. Their spot in a gig quartet is not guaranteed, however, until they receive a confirmation call from one of the student leaders and a driver has been identified. The student leaders choose musicians from the sign-ups to fill out all four parts of the music.

If you are planning a party during the season, why not **hire a Rent-A-Band** group as entertainment! You will be surprised at how much fun it is to surprise your guests with live music.

Parents, if your student has signed up and been confirmed, please consider driving the group. It's a great chance to see them perform and really gets you into the holiday spirit! Drivers also need to fill out the appropriate school district driver forms showing proper insurance coverage. These need to be on file before you drive any students for Rent-A-Band performances. If you would like to volunteer to drive or would like to order a performance, please email us at DHS.Rent-A-Band@comcast.net with your name, address, home and cell phone numbers, and we will mail you the forms.

Students can earn up to \$15 for their student accounts for each 30 minutes Rent-A-Band gig they play. If an individual student can provide at least one hour of piano music they can earn up to \$40 for each hour for their accounts. Please note that pianists have to provide their own music, practice independently, and may have to transport their keyboard, if they have one.

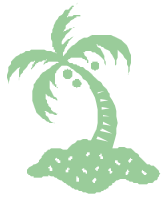

The Band is heading North!

The band's Spring trip is being planned to **Victoria**, British Columbia, to participate in the Victoria Day festivities from **May 16-20**, 2008.

Briefly, we intend to travel by air from Sacramento to Seattle, board busses to Port Angeles, onto a ferry, across the border and to Victoria. We plan to stay at Traveler's Inn, City Center, which is the most convenient and economical option. Because of the band's excellent reputation with the festival organizers, we have been offered the premier performance opportunity to play at the opening ceremony of the **Victoria Day parade**. In addition to the many performance venues that will be arranged as part of the Festival, we are working on lining up a music clinic in association with the University of Victoria.

Band students have consistently raved about past Victoria trips – the combination of unique and festive performance venues, the sight-seeing opportunities in and around Victoria such as Butchart Gardens, and the chance to visit another country make this an exceptional opportunity for your students!

More details including exact cost will be forthcoming as the plans are finalized, but understand that the unfavorable exchange rate with Canadian dollars has impacted the cost of this trip. We will do our best to keep the per student cost as close to \$650 as possible. Fundraising opportunities abound, so take advantage of them! As always, financial aid is available to those in need via a private conference with Mr. Lange.

A letter describing the trip will arrive in the mail soon; we are asking for a commitment and deposit of \$150 to secure your band student's place on the trip.

A current passport is **REQUIRED** for this trip and everyone should begin the passport application process immediately if they do not already have one!

Band Booster Minutes

October 10 Meeting

1. Kathryn Shickman was voted in as **Secretary**.
2. **Agendas and minutes needing approval** will be made available for everyone at future meetings.
3. The **minutes** from the last meeting on September were published in the Band Boosters newsletter. Copies were made available to read during the meeting. The minutes from the last meeting on Sept 12th have not yet been approved.
4. **Music Director's report:** Mr. Lange states that it is homecoming week and the bands will be participating in the parade and the football game. There is a possibility of inclement weather on Friday. Yet, we are obliged to participate in the parade. Mr. Lange requests that students whose instruments would be affected by the rain bring a plastic bag to cover their instrument if necessary. Participation at the football game is more optional.

The classes are preparing for upcoming concerts. In October, some students have been invited to perform in the Outreach Band playing along with 6th graders in concerts on Tuesday, October 16th and Thursday, October 18th. The concert honoring our new district superintendent, called Through the Eyes of a Child, is scheduled for November 13th. The Jazz Band performs a few days later on November 16th, in the Jazz Extravaganza featuring Patrick Langham, an alto sax player. December 20th is the date set for the Winter Rhapsody with both the symphonic and concert bands performing, and featuring student soloist Andy Voss. The Pep Band will be playing at the last two home football games, and then continues with basketball season after the first of the year.

Mr. Lange apologized for his comment about the Concert Band auditions in the October Newsletter. His concern was about a few students and not the entire Band.

4. **Treasurer's report:** Richard Hoover presented a recap of last year's budget, along with a recap of last months accounting. Copies of financial statements were made available. The Band Booster account as of September 30, 2007 shows \$11,425. The Music Program Account shows spending of \$5100, income of \$4100, and a balance of \$1375.

5. Committee Reports:

Car wash: John Chuck and Michael O'Brien shared that the first of three car washes will be held this Sat at the school district parking lot from 8-12 noon. There are 20 kids per shift with parents to oversee washing and to monitor snacks. Hope for good weather for that day. They requested everyone to bring their cars by. They also need extra towels, and a couple hoses. We have two shop vacuums available but could use more. Students are encouraged to sign up on the Tuesday or Wednesday before each wash date. Sign-ups for parents can be made available in advance. The orchestra is having their car wash this Saturday at the Nugget, and is charging \$10 per car. We voted on requesting a donation of \$5 for cars and \$8 for vans and trucks at the band car wash. Students sign in at each car wash. The number of hours they work is tracked. The hours are then submitted to the treasurer. The treasurer then calculates the total earnings for the day and divides them up amongst all on duty based on the number of hours worked. Earnings are allotted to each student's account towards band trip expenses.

Rummage Sale: Donations for the Rummage Sale should be brought to the car wash on Oct 20th. Luisa Nye determines the

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price of each item. Remaining items are posted for sale on the list serve. Items still not sold get donated. There will be more information to come.

Coconut Grove: Randy Chin is the Co-Chair for this fundraiser for all three bands to be held on Feb 23rd. The planning is starting right now. Even with 30 volunteers already they need more help. They are looking for help with fundraising, soliciting donations for the silent auction, and ticket sales. The first planning meeting will be scheduled in a couple weeks. Please email Randy at KatyZane@sbcglobal.net if you are interested in assisting with this event. This event is a fund raiser for all the band students. Students get a piece of the pie for their trip account for each two-hour shift worked. Jazz band players perform at the event. Some of the money raised in this event goes to the Band Booster general account. Students are encouraged to offer services (dog walking) for the silent auction. All money donated for their services goes to their student account.

Victoria: Sarah Davis announced that the band trip to Victoria is tentatively planned for May 16-20th. We will leave on Friday morning for Seattle then Victoria, and return on Tuesday. Students return to school on Wednesday. The bands perform at the Victoria Day celebration. It is an honor to be given a premier spot in the concert at the beginning of the parade. Students may also have the opportunity to participate in a band clinic at the University of Victoria. All parents are encouraged to help with this event. The initial planning meeting is next Tuesday, October 16th at 7pm at Sarah Davis' home. Her address is 1801 Chapman Pl. and phone number is 753-3299.

Entertainment Books: Janet Matlock coordinates the Entertainment Book fundraiser. She said sales have gone very well. Funds for books sold go directly into the student's account. 100% of every sixth book a student sells goes into that student's account. The formula of what % of each book sold will go to the student is to be determined on total books sold. Janet needs all orders by this week-end. She anticipates selling all 140 books. For information, contact Janet Matlock at 1115 Radcliffe Dr. or phone 792-7122.

Direct Donation: Lisa Yamauchi said letters were mailed out to 400 people. And we have already collected just over \$2000. Concert tickets for up to 5 family members will be mailed to all families donating over \$100. This does not include the Capital Jazz Project event.

Rent -a- Band: Lon and Nancy Hatamiya will be heading this event. More drivers will be needed for the gigs between Dec 6th and Dec 21st. There were over 19 gigs last year. Publicity needs to begin. Anyone interested in assisting in this way please contact the Hatamiyas. Students learn holiday music and are invited to play at different private parties in a quartet or quintet for approximately 20 to 30 minutes. A portion of the fees goes to Band Boosters and a portion to the students. In the past there have been more students than gigs. It was suggested that we solicit gigs around the capitol; there are lots of parties there.

Newsletter: Susan Hulsizer generates the monthly newsletter. She has received lots of requests to receive it on line. She will send out another message to encourage people to receive it by email only.

There was a discussion of whether to post individual committee member contact information on the website. It was suggested that people be given the option to not have their contact information posted on the list serve and the published newsletter. An option for committee members is to receive emails via the Band Booster anonymous email address, Bandbooster@gmail.com. Another suggestion was to develop a private website for Band Booster members only. President Mike Choy will inquire who does not want their info on the internet. A reminder was made that names of individual students are not to accompany photos either in the newsletter or on the website.

6. Old Business:

Auditing: The Band Booster By-Laws state that an Auditing Committee is to review the books at end of each school year and then is to pass the books along to next committee. An official audit has not been done in several years. President Mike Choy will follow up on this. It was suggested to examine the PTA audit process. They have a fairly simple audit system with each committee completing a form. Maybe we can adapt their system to fit our needs. There was a motion to table this topic until further research is done.

Volunteer Recruitment: A Fundraiser Chair person and a Publicity Coordinator are still needed. A particular Band Booster parent had been approached earlier and was in the process of deciding to take the Script Coordinator position.

7. New Business:

By-Laws review: A review of the Band Booster By-Laws is to be tabled until a later date, yet they need updating. Mike Choy would like to form a committee to review them and make recommendations. Please contact him if you are interested in helping with this process.

8. Natsoulas Jazz Artists Festival: Prior to the meeting an email was sent to Band Booster parents describing the issues with this particular Festival fundraising (The email will be included with the minutes). A lengthy discussion ensued over the allocation of money raised at the Natsoulas Jazz Artists Festival. The debate was over whether funds should be allocated to only one band, in this case the Jazz Band. Specific issues included whether this was a designated donation, whether Band Boosters was adequately informed of the event during the initial planning stages, whether a prior vote from Band Boosters should have been done in addition to the announcements, timing and relatively short notice of this event (planning mostly during the summer), previous history of directed fundraising for a particular band and whether this is appropriate now, etc. After several parents expressed their opinion on the matter a motion was made that the money raised at the 2007 Davis Jazz Artists Festival (initial projection of \$3000) is to be allocated to the Jazz band students' account to defray the cost of the New Orleans trip. The motion was seconded, then approved with a vote of only one opposed. A second motion was made that the funds be allocated to another trip or Jazz Band event this school year if New Orleans trip doesn't happen this year. The motion was seconded then passed with four opposing votes. John Natsoulas would like to make this an annual event and has started planning for a two day event next year.

9. Treasurer Richard Hoover **submitted his resignation** to be effective immediately. He turned in the BB check book and returned a bag of cash. Additionally, he has removed his name from all accounts at the bank.

10. The meeting was adjourned at 9:35pm.
