If you missed just one minute of our November programs you missed a lot! The sounds of music filled the IPA Theater this past month with performances by the DHS Symphonic and Jazz Bands. I know many of you were truly amazed by the quality of these students' presentations (In fact, sometimes they even amaze even me.)

November 13th saw the Symphonic Band with "Through The Eyes Of A Child;" music depicting childhood experiences. I'm certain you were moved by the emotions of the works played. Kudos to all the students who performed or presented orally at one of the most memorable concerts we have given at DHS. It was wonderful to see our new Superintendent of Schools, Dr. James Hammond, in attendance. I wish we could see more of our administrators at these events (Did anyone notice if the DHS Principal or one of the three Vice Principals were there?)

Three days later the Jazz Band presented its annual Extravaganza with guest artist, Mr. Patrick Langham, instructor and instructor and performer from the Dave Brubeck Jazz Studies Institute of the University Of The Pacific. All our students are working diligently preparing for their Winter Rhapsody, the bands' winter concert, this year to be held on **Thursday evening, December 20**, in our own theater. This program begins at 7:30p and features the first performance this year of the DHS Concert Band conducted by yours truly and Mr. John Cargile, my instructional accomplice . . . er, instructional aide. I'm sure all of you will be amazed at the quality of music your students are producing.

This concert will feature some exciting works expressly written for concert band and others which are transcriptions of standard classical repertoire. The Concert Band will perform the Concert March, "Silvercrest," the tone poem "Psalm and Celebration," by noted band composer, Bruce Pearson. In addition, there will be a transcription of Handel's "Adagio and Allegro," and a fun-filled new work with a calypso beat, "Mary's Boy Child," by the famed African-American choral director Jester Hairston.

The Symphonic Band then takes over with a performance of some seasonal favorites "The Carol Of The Bells," and "Patapan." We also use this concert to feature the talents of one very special band student as soloist with the band. This year it will be Andy Voss performing "The Flight Of The Bumblebee," by Nicolai Rimsky-Korsakov on the xylophone. You won't believe your ears! Who could believe that one person could play so fast! The concluding number from the Symphonic Band will be "The Eighth Candle," by Steven Reisteter. This work is a musical depiction of the last candle of the menorah - "the eighth candle is for courage."

The final part of this evening will be the presentation of some works by with the combined forces of both the Concert and Symphonic Bands including "Jesu, Joy Of A Man's Desiring," and our traditional concluding work "Auld Lang Syne."

Tickets for this evening will only be available at the door and will be \$7.00 General Admission, \$6.00 Students/Seniors and \$15.00 for the entire family!

Finally, I want to wish you all the happiest of times this season. The band people are the best people I know and your students really are the cream of the school. You are all special people and I am personally thankful to call all of you my friends.

Jazz Band Earns “Superior” Rating at Delta Jazz Festival

The DHS Jazz Band achieved Superior ratings and a third place finish at the Delta Jazz Festival on Saturday, December 1. The Festival, held at San Joaquin Delta Community College in Stockton, drew bands and combos from throughout the Central Valley and Bay Area.



The Jazz Band played three pieces, demonstrating both excellent ensemble and individual performances. Michelle Rabowsky and Jonathan Kelley soloed and “dueted” on “Picture 4,” while “I hear a Rhapsody” featured Christine Hulsizer and James Blake. Jonathan Kelley, Andy Voss and the entire band provided sufficient electricity on “Caravan” to qualify for federal subsidies for renewable energy.

The Band scored a 94 rating, two points behind second-place Folsom “A” and three points behind Buchanan “A” (Clovis). “Outstanding Soloist Awards” went to Jonathan Kelly, Christine Hulsizer and Andy Voss. Most importantly, the Band’s Superior rating enables Mr. Lange to submit an application and audition tape to the Monterey Jazz Festival Next Generation Competition.

Are You Connected?

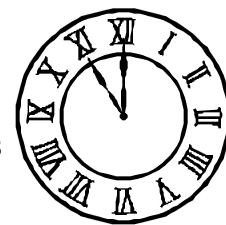

What: All-Night Musical Marathon Fundraiser

When: Saturday, January 26, 7 p.m. to Sunday, January 27, 7 a.m. (Monday, January 28 is a non-student teacher workday, so there is an extra day to catch up on sleep!)

Where: DHS Multi-purpose Room and M-1

Who: All Concert, Symphonic and Jazz Band students, band teachers, parent chaperones, volunteers, guest players and conductors

This fundraiser is voluntary but strongly encouraged for those who like to have FUN. Students seek pledges from family, friends and neighbors to spur them on to stay awake playing and listening to band performances all night long. All pledges go directly into each student's account for the Spring Trip to Victoria, B. C! This event begins with a Concert at 7:30 p.m., which is open to parents and public. The Concert, Symphonic and Jazz Bands will play.

The adults who have made special donations of \$25, may participate with the Band in the next mini-concert by either playing their instruments or conducting the Band. At midnight, doors close to the public. For the rest of the night, sub-groups of band students perform every hour. When not performing, students enjoy snacks, pizza, bagels or treats provided by local businesses and volunteers. Some students may even try to "catch a few Z's" in M-1 if pranksters allow (under the mindful eye of our chaperones, that is.) Parents may return at 7 a.m. for the Final Concert after which we all clean up and go home.

How you can help:

- PLEDGE SHEET--Encourage your band student to seek pledges, especially during the holiday season when relatives and guests can be plentiful. Also, for only \$25, you can be involved as a guest conductor or band participant.
- FOOD--Snacks will be provided, but students usually like to bring their own snacks, and we do ask that each student bring a six-pack of their favorite beverage and snack to share.
- COMFORT--Encourage your band student to dress comfortably and bring a pillow and/or sleeping bag or blanket.

Passports Needed for Victoria Trip

ALERT! MAKE SURE YOU HAVE CURRENT PASSPORTS FOR VICTORIA BAND TRIP !

Participation in the band trip to Victoria, Canada, next spring requires that each student (and parent chaperone) has a current passport. For those participating:

1. If you have a passport that is valid through May 2008, immediately please send a copy of the first page (w/ picture) to school (to band room) or by mail to Kate Scow, 760 North Campus Way, Davis CA 95616.
2. If you are a US citizen and do not have a current passport, please apply for one immediately. The website for this is http://travel.state.gov/passport/passport_1738.html You can apply at the Davis Post Office for a new passport and renew an existing passport via mail. Allow 4 to 6 weeks to receive your passport after submitting the application. Note that for minors under 14, there are more rigid requirements. After you receive your passport, bring a copy into school or mail as above (see #1).
3. If you are not a US citizen, please check that your passport is valid through May, 2008, renew if needed, and send copy of first page as above (#1)

Band Booster Minutes

November 7th Meeting

DHS Band Booster Meeting

Nov 7th 2007, PA-3

President Mike Choy called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

Approval of the Minutes: The meeting minutes from the September and October meetings as published in the newsletter were approved unanimously without amendment. **(VOTE)**

Music Director Report: Pep Band Director Ana Ibrahim reported that the Pep band finished out the football season with style and has custom-designed hooded sweatshirts for sale. The first basketball game at which the band will play will be Tuesday, December 4th, for the boys vs. Woodland. Other games for pep band performances will be on Fridays.

Director Fred Lange reports that the Symphonic band concert on Nov 13th will be entitled "Through the Eyes of a Child." The new superintendent will attend and address the audience on his first official day of work. The music relates to childhood themes and one piece, Circus Franticus, will have a video accompaniment by student Chris Zabortink. Three days later the Jazz Band has its fall concert, "Jazz Extravaganza" with guest artist Patrick Langham. He is a professor of music at UOP and played saxophone with the Capitol Jazz Project concert last April. There will be upcoming rehearsals for Rent-a-Band Wed and Thurs, and the combined band rehearsal for the concert Dec 20th. The Jazz Band will be competing in the Delta College Jazz Festival on Saturday, Dec 1st in Stockton. Mr. Lange also reported that Tim Smith of CSU Hayward recently held a clinic for the symphonic band which was a rewarding learning experience.

Committee Reports:

Car Washes: Mike O'Brien reported the three October car washes made about \$2,300. He thanked the students and said it was a lot of fun. (All of this money goes into the accounts of students who worked at the car washes.) Mike Choy suggested that since the car washes make good profits with minimal prep work, perhaps we could try these in the spring as well.

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Rummage Sale: Mike reported that the rummage sale brought in \$370, which was more than last year, many thanks to Luisa Nye.

Coconut Grove: The subcommittees are starting to work on the event. They are considering a change from last year of having snacks and desserts, but not a meal, since it was expensive and perhaps unnecessary to provide the full meal.

Victoria Trip: Sarah Davis reported the trip will be May 16-20, and a letter will be arriving in the mail soon to each band family asking for the first deposit on the trip. It is expected that it will cost \$650 to \$700 per student for travel, lodging, and some of the meals. The committee highly encourages students to participate in the many fundraisers of the boosters. Financial aid is available for families in need. Passports are required for this trip, and you should apply now.

New Orleans Trip: Peter Matlock reports the Jazz Band will travel to N.O. April 10-13. They will participate in a festival in the French Quarter and arrangements are being made for clinics/concerts at the University of New Orleans. The cost will not be determined until the flight reservations are made.

Scrip: Larry Lagerstrom reports that the first order form is in the November newsletter, and on listserv. Nugget cards will be available at the meeting. Think about your holiday shopping: iTunes, LL Bean offer money back to the boosters at no additional cost to you. Last year scrip raised \$3-4 thousand dollars. This money goes into the general accounts, and not the student accounts.

Rent-a-Band: Lon Hatamiya reports that the Rent-a-Band is off to a great start. There are lots of bookings already, including the Davis Commons every Saturday in December. The money is earned by the students for their travel accounts, \$15 per musician per gig. The rent-a-bands are available from Nov 29 through Dec 21st, evenings and weekends (outside of school time.)

Lamppost Pizza fundraisers: Stephanie Hunt reports that the fundraisers will be Wed Dec 12th, Tues Feb 26th, and Tues Apr 15th. You must tell them it's for the band boosters when you order, and you can either eat there or take it home. Lamppost will give 33% of the cost from each pizza to the boosters. (The manager there is a former DHS band member.)

Direct Donations: Lisa Yamauchi reports that the drive is going well and they have raised \$6800 so far for an instrument fund for the school.

Concert committee: The Habermans got good advice on soliciting boosters for baked goods and drinks for the upcoming concerts, as well as finding 3 to 4 people to take money at the door. The cost for the concerts will be \$7 for adults, \$6 for students or seniors and \$20 for a family. It was reported that we are required to pay \$150 per event to use the theater, which comes from the music program fund.

Old Business

Auditing Committee. Mike Choy proposed that the boosters use a professional to prepare the income tax by January 15th. This would not be a formal audit, but would serve to make a clearer picture of income and expenditures. It was reported that the accountant Geraldine Hagie, who has experience with nonprofit groups, would be willing to put the tax report together for about \$180. The boosters voted unanimously to support this proposal to have a professional do the tax report and authorize up to \$300 for this purpose. **(VOTE)**

Treasurer Position: Joyce Boulanger, who has experience bookkeeping is volunteering for the vacant Treasurer position. The boosters unanimously elected her. **(VOTE)**

Publicity: The publicity coordinator vacancy has been filled by Laurie Briscoe. Some help was offered for the photo shoot tomorrow for the concert publicity, with various boosters volunteering their students to pose for the Davis Enterprise photo.

New Business:

E-mail addresses: Mike Choy brought up the possibility of setting up descriptive e-mail addresses such as the Hatamiyas have for the rent-a-band, which could be passed on to the next year. He invites the various officers and coordinators to let him know if this would be appropriate for their band contact. It would be transparent for incoming e-mails, (merging with your person e-mails) but would take a little practice in using it for outgoing e-mails.

Meeting Dates: Last year and in the by-laws the meetings were to be held on Thursdays. The schedule this year has been published for meetings on Wednesdays, which is better for the many boosters who are involved with the SYS bands on Thursday nights. The Boosters unanimously agreed to approve the meeting schedule published at the beginning of the year, with meetings generally on the second Wednesday of the month. **(VOTE)**

By-law Committee: As reported at the last meeting there will be a committee to review the by-laws to amend them for current use. The last revision was 1995, and the by-laws contain set meeting day on a particular Thursday of each month (This set date is not necessarily the best day depending on the makeup of the membership for each year) and refer to an obsolete phone committee. Peter, Steve, Mike and Rick Hoover have volunteered to serve on the committee. The revised by-laws need to be posted for 30 days before formal adoption by the boosters by vote at a regular meeting.

Website: It was brought up that the boosters need the password for the website. Joyce Hamaguchi will look into obtaining it from the DCN team.

Adjourned at 8:35.
