## A Message from the Band Booster President

#### Music \ 'myü-zik \ n

1a: the science or art of incorporating intelligible combinations of tones into a composition having structure and continuity

1b: vocal or instrumental sounds having rhythm, melody, or harmony

Although I am not a scholar of the language arts, I think Mr. Webster forgot some things in his definition of music. Yes, music is tones and sounds having rhythm, melody, harmony, structure and continuity – but what about joy and sadness, excitement, anger, tension and release, suspense, edgy, calm, soothing, quiet, boisterous, loud, love or hate. What about all of these? A good writer can bring about any one of these emotions within several pages of a book, and we place value in that author's ability. An accomplished musician can bring about any one of these emotions within 1 or 2 minutes of playing or singing.

In elementary math class we learn to count to 10. Then we learn there is a repeating pattern to counting and the patterns can become more complex leading to higher levels of math. We find value in learning these mathematical patterns, both for practical reasons and for abstract reasons. Music has rhythm and structure – 2 beats to a measure, 3 beats to a measure, 4 beats to a measure. Students of jazz learn there is a 12 bar structure commonly found in blues. In classical music, Beethoven began with a pattern of 4 notes, 3 of the 4 having the same pitch, and built patterns from these 4 simple notes to create one of the best-known symphonies in the world.

In our history classes we learn how thousands of people were captured in Africa and brought to America to be sold as slaves. We learn how this has shaped our country today. Historians describe the emotional pain these people endured, and we know the importance of learning about these events. When listening to the early songs of these people, we feel the pain and we feel the brief moments of joy. The study and playing of their music gives us a glimpse of their repression.

Let's do everything we can to preserve this "core" subject in our schools.

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Are you upset about the elimination of the elementary band and orchestra music program next year? Then become part of the solution.

#### 1. Donate Money to Save the Music Program.

Don't delay, the district must make final decisions on rehiring teachers on May 15th. The earlier your donation is recorded, the earlier our four "pink-slipped" music teachers can be assured they will have a position next year.

#### 2. Donate Money to Restore All Cut Programs.

Please support the fundraising of the Davis Schools Foundation to restore the programs cut by the district due to the current deficit. Our students need more than music. The DSF website is at

As a fan or parent of a high school musician, you know the power of making music can transform the lives of young people. Let's give this opportunity to a new generation of Davis students.



#### 1. Who is DSOMA?

DSOMA is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to "promote excellence and support Davis Joint Unified School District young musicians and staff in orchestral music programs through fundraising, classroom assistance, touring organization and related group activities."

#### 2. Why does the Save Our Music (SOM) campaign fall under DSOMA?

DSOMA is an established non-profit organization with district-wide scope supporting orchestral school music at all levels. For this reason DSOMA was selected by consensus of the music teachers and school music booster organizations to be the coordinating organization for SOM fund raising. A separate bank account has been established for the collection of all money donated to the SOM campaign.

#### 3. What is the fund raising goal?

\$200,000

#### 4. What will my donation do?

It will sustain the Elementary Music Program for the 2008-09 school year and keep the following Secondary School Music Teachers employed in their respective music specialties.

- Angelo Moreno (Emerson Advanced Orchestra Holmes Advanced Orchestra, DHS Chamber Orchestra DHS Symphony Orchestra)
- Bill Zinn (Holmes Choir, DHS Concert Choir, DHS Jazz Choir, Harper Choir, Music Essentials)
- Clyde Quick (Holmes Bands)
- Greg Brucker (Emerson Intermediate Orchestra, Harper Intermediate Orchestra, Harper Advanced Orchestra) These teachers have been pink slipped and are being selected for layoff due to Seniority Teacher Union Rights.

#### 5. What happens if you don't reach your \$200,000 goal?

We will "buy back" as much as we can with the donations we receive.

#### 6. What happens to the money if you surpass your \$200,000 goal?

Any surplus money will be retained in case similar budget hardships affect the elementary music program for the following 2009-2010 school year.

#### 7. What will happen to the music program for the year after? (the 2009-2010 school year)

Most predictions indicate that the district will have a lower projected deficit for the following year. Our intent is to raise funds only for the 2008-2009 school year. The district has suggested putting an emergency parcel tax on the ballot for November 2008. We also anticipate that the longer lead time in preparation for that budget will allow better discussion of

# **Band Trip to Victoria Update**

The tickets have been bought, the rooms reserved, the buses booked, the ferry scheduled, and the venues arranged...Victoria here we come!

Here is a brief trip summary; a detailed itinerary will be provided to you prior to the trip.

We will be staying at the Traveler's Inn, City Center, and have arranged for a full cooked breakfast to be provided each morning, included in the cost of the trip.

Thursday May 15: drop off instruments and dress blacks to the IPAB before noon

Friday May 16: early morning departures from DHS via carpools to the Sacramento Airport, fly to Seattle, board buses, travel via bus and ferry to Victoria. Group1 will visit Seattle's Experience Music Project Museum on the way to Victoria. Dinner provided at hotel.

Saturday May 17: Combined and Jazz Band performances at venues throughout Victoria.

Sunday May 18: Butchart Gardens tour (box lunch provided), Combined Band and Jazz Band performances. Dinner provided at hotel.

Monday May 19: Combined Band plays at the opening of the Victoria Day parade, later in the day Combined Band and Jazz Band perform.

Tuesday May 20: depart for Davis via bus, ferry, plane. Group 2 will visit Seattle's Experience Music Project Museum on the way to the airport. Carpools pick up at Sacramento Airport in the afternoon/evening.

#### A few bookkeeping issues:

- A packet of forms will be sent home with your students in about a week. Please fill them out completely and get them back to the band room as soon as possible.
- Your last payment coupon should arrive via e-mail in the next week; please respond promptly.
- We will be soliciting drivers to take us to and from the Sacramento airport

- Sign-ups for hotel rooms will be circulated in class soon. Students must sign up in groups of four.

# **Band Booster Minutes**

# March 12, 2008 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:45pm.

I. Music Director's report – Mr. Lange says we are all aware of the school district financial crisis. At this date, the elementary music program has been cut from the budget. The "Davis Save our Music" drive through the DSOMA is being organized to collect money to reinstate the program. The amount determined to keep the music program afloat is \$100/student. In a parallel effort, the Davis Schools Foundation (DSF) is organizing the \$1/day campaign, that kicked off today, to collect funds to be divided up equally amongst all in the school district that need it. In our efforts to gather funds specifically for the music program we will have envelopes at concerts, and signs that encourage everyone to give. He asks that we do what we can to support our music program.

There was a discussion of how best to make donations to these funds. At the time of this meeting, details of how funds will be collected were being determined. All funds needed must be collected by May 15th, 2008, or jobs will be cut. If funds are gathered after that date, there is a possibility that jobs can be reinstated.

Leslie Chuck will give Mr. Lange 400 flyers for the DSF \$1/day campaign to distribute to the high school music students. The \$100/student will go through DSOMA as Davis Save Our Music supports the whole music program. Leslie Chuck says the DSAF has grants available to fund the IPAB fees.

II. Minutes - The minutes from the February meeting were approved.

III. Treasurer's report - Clyde Kelly says the books are still balancing. The bank statements show income of \$21,000 from several fundraisers like Coconut Grove and Rent-A-Band. Expenses for the month were \$2700, mainly tympani, and snare repair, bass clarinet repairs, and the purchase of a new electric string bass. There are lots of expenses coming up in March and April with the band trips. The BB general account has just under \$15,000. The music account has near \$10,000. A Lamppost check for \$161 is not yet included in this month's deposits.

#### IV. Committee reports -

- A. Student report from Ana and Miranda –On March 22nd, the Pep Band will perform in a Kiddie Parade, and arrangements are being made for the Pep Band to participate in UCD's Picnic Day on April 19th.
- B. Coconut Grove The coordinators report that "it's over!" with a profit of \$9,000. The event made more money than ever by not serving dinner and only offering drinks and dessert. The auction made \$4200 this year, which was up from last year, but the raffle did not do as well as it had in previous years. Suggestions for next time included offering appetizers along with sweet desserts. Students say working this event was much more organized this year and they were very happy with the \$15/hour earned. Mr. Lange says this event couldn't have been chaired by two nicer people, compliments to Randy Chinn and Michael Coleman.
- C. Victoria trip -The hotel will be paid in full in March to save on a value-added tax and get a \$2400 refund. If families haven't received an announcement about the second payment due, please notify John Horn. Final payments will be due in April as well as "permission packets". Alaska Airlines changed the flight times so adjustments are being made to the itinerary Activities include pizza at the hotel on Friday evening, a burger bar and dancing at the hotel on Sunday evening, a tour of Buchart Gardens in Victoria, and Experience Music Project museum in Seattle, and possibly the Crystal Pool indoor pool with 160 foot slide, for another evening activity. Activities for Saturday and Monday are being researched. Students are encouraged to make suggestions of options for activities. To date there are 146 people going on the trip, 122 students with 24 adults.
- D. New Orleans trip Mr. Lange says the trip plans are going well. They have scheduled a performance and clinic at the University of New Orleans, along with a couple other venues. Other activities include a swamp tour and a dinner and dance at a Cajun restaurant.
- E. Script Order forms were made available. This year the script is not bringing in much money. The other type of script where you use your card at Nugget has been much more successful at raising funds. We will discuss our best fundraising options at a future spring meeting.
- F. LampPost Pizza This fundraiser brought in about \$200 in December and \$161 in February. The next fundraiser is on 4/15.
- G. Direct donations The collection of personal donations went extremely well. And some funds from corporate sponsors came through. Coconut Grove went after large corporations and two came through. We will discuss which fundraising proves most successful closer to the end of the year.
  - H. Spring Car Washes (4/5 and 4/26) The next car washes are scheduled for 4/5 and 4/26.

- I. Concert fundraising Mr. Lange reports there are three concerts coming up. On Thurs evening, 3/21, the concert and symphonic bands will play an adjudicated performance open to the public. Dr. Tim Smith, formerly from CSU East Bay and now at CSUS is coming to spend the entire afternoon with the concert band. On Friday, 3/21, the Jazz Band and Jazz Choir will perform at their concert called Bound for New Orleans. All events are at the IPAB. Funds raised at these events will be split between the two groups and used towards New Orleans, Victoria, and Monterey trips. On Saturday evening there is a concert sponsoring the Davis Youth Flute Choir who is preparing for a trip to Japan. There will be a silent auction and food available before the concert at IPAB. Mike wrote them a letter of recommendation on behalf of the Band Boosters to receive a grant for the performance of a specific piece with Adam Jenkins.
- J. Publicity There will be a photo shoot on Friday. Concert announcements have been appearing in the Enterprise. Arrangements have been made with some students to be available in their concert clothes for photos.

K. Playathon – This event has brought in \$13,261 to date and donations are still coming in.

#### V. Old Business

A. Subsidy of trips - The Band Boosters will subsidize major trip related expenses for the different bands. It was previously decided that it was ok to support these trips. At this meeting we discussed how much to subsidize and for what expenses. In the past Mr. Lange has volunteered some of his music fund. President Mike Choy proposed subsidizing \$2,825:

1.	Victoria dinner	\$1,800	
2.	Victoria road crew t-shirts for 14 students	\$200	
3.	T-shirt design award for the Victoria trip	\$25	
4.	New Orleans large instrument transportation or rental subsidy	\$800	
(still determining how best to transport large instruments to New Orleans)			

Funds for these expenses can come from the distribution of money from Coconut Grove:

Gross income	11,719
Student hours 440 X \$15	-6,600
Student auction	-448
Expenses	-2,700
Remainder	\$1,971

Mike proposed we put that amount into the BB account to maintain a \$15K balance for initial expenses at the beginning of next school year.

Money summary estimates:

BB general account	\$15,000
Music account loan repayment	+4,000
Coconut Grove	+1,971
Subsidy	-2,825
Student aid	-3,000
Final BB general account	\$15,146

All voted in favor of subsidizing the band trips for \$800 instrument transportation to New Orleans, \$25 for t-shirt design credit, \$200 for road crew and \$1800 for dinner in Victoria, for a total of \$2825. All voted in favor of allocating Coconut Grove funds as Mike proposed to cover these expenses.

#### VI. New Business

A. Rominger West Wine Tasting Fundraiser – There are different opinions on how much work it will take to do this event. Mike thinks it is not the right time to consider taking on this event. The BB parents have already organized several events this year. We should consider this event for next year in the fall or winter.

B. Dos Coyotes – Dos Coyotes now has fundraising two days a week. We may want to consider using Dos Coyotes and Lamppost next year. Other schools have had difficulty gathering their funds from Dos Coyotes, because the restaurant has lots of restrictions such as you must have a coupon and only dine in. We can address this later in the year.

C. Picnic Day Parking Fundraiser (4/19) – We can sell parking at the DJUSD parking lot on Picnic Day morning. We need someone to coordinate this simple project. People are needed to sell spaces until the lot is full, approximately two hours. Mike will put a call out on the listserve to see if anyone is willing to help with this. John Chuck has it reserved. Mike will confirm reservation.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40pm.
