#### BAND BOOSTER MINUTES

#### JANUARY 14, 2009MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 7:36pm.

- I. The minutes from the December meeting were approved as published in the January newsletter.
- II. Music Director's report Mr. Lange reviewed the schedule for the coming months including Play-a-thon, Folsom Jazz Festival, Coconut Grove, Pep Band at basketball games, and the Festivity of Bands (see calendar for details). Seven students were accepted to the NorCal Honor Band (Feb 5-7, CSU Humboldt) Jon Hatamiya, Trombone; Liliana Moore, Trumpet; Elise Peauroi, Horn; Christina Chew, Christine Chu, Jung-Eun Shin, Jane Seo, Flutes. Two students were accepted to the All State Honor band: Jon Hatamiya, Trombone (Feb 19-22 in Fresno); and Jane Seo, Flute (March 26-29 in Ontario). Congratulations to all!
- III. Treasurer's report Jo Andrew Merges says all is going well with the band finances. Concert Receipts for Fall 2008: Symphonic Band, 11/16, \$1,092; Jazz Band, 11/21, \$1,089; Winter Rapsody, 12/18, \$1312. There is \$8,500 in the Music Program fund, and \$7,700 in the General Fund. The Performing Arts fund has \$4500 and the BB savings account holds \$15,000. Student accounts have about \$7,000. It is extremely easy to identify what is in each student's account. Officers will meet to plan how to keep record of payments for the San Diego trip. Our income taxes are nearly ready.

#### IV. Committee reports

- A. Student report No report as Sam was directing pep band.
- B. Car wash Dates for the Spring Car Wash events are March 21<sup>st</sup> and April 25<sup>th</sup>. Parent volunteers are needed to assist with each. Student sign-up sheets will be posted in the Music Room.
  - C. Direct Donations To date we have brought in \$8,886 from 77 donors.
- D. Rent-a-Band Lon Hatamiya shared that we had 22 gigs which raised \$1,100 for students' accounts. Many people were interested in reserving groups again for next year.
- E. Playathon Pledge sheets were distributed to students, and permission slips are to come out soon. T-shirts have been ordered. All coordination is going very well. We will request donations for food items for friends and family watching the concerts. Parents can make an extra \$25 donation for an opportunity to conduct.
- F. Coconut Grove There have been a number of planning meetings already. They could use volunteers for set-up and clean-up and baking dessert. There will be a raffle for a Wii. It was suggested to consider multiple prizes for the raffle. This year advertising for the event is being increased and will include The Enterprise, all DHS class listservers and Celia Cottle's groups. There are not as many business donations nor are they as generous as in the past. They are collecting donations for the silent auction. Families are encouraged to think of items they can donate to the auction (basket of interesting goodies, vacation destinations, and sports memorabilia). Appetizers and drinks will be served earlier in the evening, with desserts served later on. This is a very important function because it involves music groups from the community, including the junior high jazz bands and Celia's jazz groups. This event is a great community builder.
- G. San Diego trip All venues are being confirmed including the Festival and day at Sea World, Seaport Village or Old Town, Midway and band bbq at a park, the San Diego Zoo, Master's Classes at University of San Diego, and a pizza party at our hotel. We need a certified DJUSD employee to join us as a chaperone. First trip payments are due 1/16. Discussion about our insurance coverage took place. Jo Andrews will be looking into increasing our coverage.
- H. Concerts, CD/DVD sales DVD's from the last concert will be available the week of the 1/19 and will be distributed to students. If there is way to have a form for people to order DVD's after concerts. It was requested to create a way for individuals to order CD's or DVD's up to one week after each concert. Vice President, John Horn will contact Gail about this change.
- I. Scrip Nugget brought in \$152.47. The next Lamppost Pizza night is 2/19. The next Yogurt Shack date is 2/18 from 4-7pm before the Festivity of Bands evening. John will make an email announcement about this.

#### V. Old Business

A. DHS BB ByLaws Proposal – The proposed revisions to the Bylaws are complete and were emailed to all. John Horn has requested input. He will incorporate all comments then submit them to all for another review. We will vote on the proposed changes at the February Band Booster meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:32pm. The next Band Booster meeting is Wednesday, February 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm room PA3.
