Notes from the Director 🦪

A very important event for the Concert and Symphonic Bands takes place Thursday next week in our own IPAB Theater. I'm talking about the annual Adjudication Concert. This is the opportunity for someone outside our circle of friends to come to DHS and listen to the wo0rk being done by our students and evaluate the performances.

This inspiration of this concert came a few years ago when I realized that in order to take our two bands to festival it would cost us almost \$1,000 for fees and buses. I decided that for a portion of that amount I could hire a noted band authority from this area to come in and work with our students. That way instead of getting only written comments and some garbled tape recordings, I would be able to have the adjudicator work personally with the students – showing them how to improve.

The format of the day is as follows; first he will come to Jazz Band class and listen to the students – helping them to perform better. Then during 7th period, Concert Band, we will play for him and then he will have almost an hour to present to the students.

At the concert that evening first the Concert Band will repeat the performance from the afternoon, brief comments will be given then intermission. The Symphonic Band will then perform and he will spend a while presenting to them.

The adjudicator I've invited this year is Mr. Merle Wamhoff, Department Chair at Delta College of Stockton. Mr. Wamhoff has served as Director of Bands at Santa Rosa Junior College and been Conductor of the All-State Honor Bands.

And the music? Well, the Concert Band will be performing "A Longford Legend," a collection of Irish Street Songs (a St. Patty's Day tribute); "I Am," a very moving tribute to a band student from Texas who was tragically killed; and "Chesapeake," an exciting portrayal of a band of American indians which disappeared in the 17th century. The Symphonic Band will perform "Triumph," a fast-paced opener; "The Whispering Tree," (from our Festivity Concert last month); and "Impressions of Japan," a three-movement work descriptive of the mysterious island nation. More surprises are in store, but I will leave those for you to find out about.

No admission will be charged (though donations are gladly accepted!) The concert begins at 7:30 pm and will end about 9:00.

BAND BOOSTER MINUTES FEBRUARY 11, 2009 MEETING

I. The January **minutes** were approved with minor changes. The next Yogurt Shack fundraising evening was stated incorrectly, the correct date is 3/18/09.

II. Music Director's report- Mr. Lange says the Symphonic band is preparing for the Festivity of Bands together with the CSUS and UCD bands at the IPAB on 2/18/09. Admission is free. The symphonic and concert bands will also participate in an adjudicated concert on 3/19/09 with professor Merle Wamhoff from Delta College in Stockton who will spend the day working with the students. The evening concert in the IPAB is also free. The Jazz Band is performing at Coconut Grove on 2/28/09. Both the Jazz Band and the Combo won their divisions at the Folsom Jazz Festival. Unfortunately, the Jazz Band was not accepted at the Monterey Jazz Festival this year. However, they will be participating in the Reno Jazz Festival in April. Thanks to our administration who gave us permission to go to Reno during STAR testing. Testing will be made up. Jon Hatamiya and Jane Seo were both first chair, and Christine Chu was third chair in the Nor Cal honor bands.

III. Treasurer's report - Jo Andrews Merges provided us with a thorough mid year financial report. Details available upon request, email Jo at <u>itandrews@ucdavis.edu</u>.

A motion was made that President Mike Choy have the discretion to spend from the BB General Fund up to \$2500 to cover costs of the San Diego Trip music clinics at USD. It was seconded and then unanimously approved.

A motion was made to allocate up to \$1500 from the General Fund to subsidize the Reno Jazz Festival expenses including the registration fees and hotel. It was seconded and then approved unanimously.

IV. Committee reports

A. Student report - none

B. Car wash - March 21st and April 25th

C. Direct Donations - \$8,986 has been raised from 79 total donors.

D. Playathon – Thank you to two wonderful young men, John Cargile from CSUS and Chris Weisker from UOP, for leading the nightlong event. The kids stayed focused with high energy. They were challenged with hard music, rewarded with fun music, and Broadway singing. John and Chris kept things rolling and the event was very successful. In future years it would be great to "play up" more community involvement. We could include junior high school players and more adult players, and make the event more inviting to the Davis community.

E. Coconut Grove – Much of what is raised at Coconut Grove goes directly to students' accounts, paying them at a good hourly rate for their service that evening. Some money is allocated to the General Fund. Donations and registration are comparable to last year. The planning committee could use some adult help the evening of the event. Several large tables are needed. Student sign-ups are available in the band room.

F. Reno Jazz Festival – The Jazz band will be participating in the Reno Jazz Festival 4/24/09.

G. San Diego trip – All requests for financial assistance should be made before the next payments are due at the beginning of March. The students will be touring the campus of the University of San Diego, and then participating in rotations through full band clinics, master clinics, and observation of other groups.

H. Concerts, CD/DVD sales – A discussion regarding the loss incurred on sales of DVD's and CD's included details that we provide a service to those who want a recording of concerts, we create an archive of our performances, and we then have recordings to use for auditions or scholarship applications. John Horn is making arrangements to submit all DVD and CD orders one week after any concert date to allow people to still order them after the performance.

I. Scrip – It was suggested that we make a "concerted" effort to encourage band families to use Nugget script. Mike will talk to our script coordinator about enhancing our script program

K. Capital Jazz Project Concert – On 3/29/09 The Jazz Band will be participating in a clinic with members of Capital Jazz Project and then performing with them in the evening. This is not one of our regularly scheduled concerts. We will be charging admission at the door. The musicians have agreed to waive their regular fee and accept the net gate proceeds as payment. We will need help with publicity, posters, etc.

V. Old Business – The suggested changes in the bylaws give the BB officers freedom to make decisions more immediately, but the decisions still need to be brought before the BB members at the BB meetings for final approval. They now better reflect how we have been doing business in the last several years. The changes from the last draft of proposed changes (mainly minor typos and grammatical corrections) were distributed via email to all band families for review prior to this meeting. A suggestion was made to add back to the purpose of the band program the phrase "have fun, make friends, and be amazed." A motion was made and seconded that we accept the changes to the bylaws with grammatical corrections made and typos corrected. There was no further discussion. A vote was taken with no opposition. The new bylaws were approved.

The meeting adjourned at 9:01 pm. The next Band Booster meeting is scheduled for March 11, 2009 at 7:30pm.
