We had 2 major concerts in March. The Concert Band and the Symphonic Band each were able to play at the Adjudication Concert and both bands did a fabulous job. As Mr. Lange has explained, we are able to obtain professional judging and comments at less cost than traveling to a judged band event. The Jazz Band played at the Capital Jazz Project Concert and had received comments from all of these professional musicians a few days earlier. The Capital Jazz Project musicians really do this event as an educational experience for our students and their only financial compensation is the Concert fees that we collect from the audience. This year we did much better than last year and I want to thank you for your support.

We still have 2 great band trips coming up. The Jazz Band will be competing at the Reno Jazz Festival, which is a fairly large and very competitive festival. Then we are taking all three Bands to San Diego. Almost all the details have been worked out for both trips, and I think most of you will agree these Band trips are the most memorable events for our students.

Overall, Band Boosters has done well this year and I want to let you know how much I appreciate your support and hard work. We will have a few open coordinator/chair positions and the treasurer position open next year. The current Band officers will be confirming who will be staying in those positions and we will start looking at potentially filling vacant spots during the remainder of this year. BAND BOOSTER MINUTES

MARCH 11, 2009

DHS Band Boosters Meeting March 11, 2009

The meeting began at 7:41pm.

- I. The minutes from the February meeting were approved as printed in the March newsletter with amendments to the funds approved for San Diego trip to read \$2650.
- II. Music Director's report The DHS symphonic band sounded excellent when playing along with the CSUS and UCD bands at the Festivity of Bands. Coconut Grove was very successful. March 19th is the Adjudication Concert with Symphonic and Concert bands working with Merle Wamhoff department chair from San Joaquin Delta College. March 29th the Jazz Band is performing with Capital Jazz Project. A couple members of CJP are coming to work with Jazz band students in class.
- III. Treasurer's report Jo Andrews Merges reports that all is going very efficiently. We have \$15,000 in reserve, approximately \$10,000 in the general fund, and \$7400 in the music fund.

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IV. Committee reports

- A. Student report –Pep Band will play at Patwin on 3/28 at their Walk-a-thon.
- B. Car wash $-3/21^{st}$ and $4/25^{th}$ Sign-ups on the band room bulletin board
- C. Coconut Grove Thank you to the co-chairs and all who volunteered at this event. There were a record number (272) of tickets sold for the event this year. The estimate of net profits is around \$9,000; this is about what we made last year. The silent auction did ok but things didn't sell at rates like last year. Students recorded 350 hours of work. There will be some funds leftover from the profits of this event to be allocated to the general fund. President Mike Choy would like to consider increasing the subsidies of the band clinics on the San Diego Trip. He will bring this up at the next BB meeting if necessary. John will provide Fred with a list of students not attending the band trip. Fred will inquire with all as to why they are not attending the trip. However, there are a very few limited number of additional spaces available at this time.
- D. Reno Jazz Festival We need a carpool organizer. We have chaperones. Room lists sign-ups to be posted.
- E. San Diego trip 5/15 5/19 -John Horn reviewed the itinerary. Details are available from Trip Coordinator Katie Horn at <u>jazzyhorns@aol.com</u> Mike Choy authorized the road crew to purchase 13 t-shirts
- F. Lamppost and Yogurt Shack -3/18/09. John Horn will post a reminder on the listserv.
- G. Capital Jazz Project Concert Bring friends, drag neighbors to this fantastic concert. Each jazz band student is to post 10 flyers announcing the concert around town. We could use help selling tickets. We voted and approved for the Band Boosters to pay for the IPAB expense for CJP concert.

V. New Business

A. Hiram Jackson from "SOM" (Save Our Music, the campaign to save the cuts to the music program proposed one year ago.) – Mr. Jackson shared that there are no cuts proposed to the music programs for 2009-2010 school year. Measure W protects the elementary music programs and some secondary music programs for the next three years. We do need to think what will happen to our music programs when Measure W expires. With approval from all music teachers, some money from the SOM fundraiser has been allocated to a video project creating up to three 3-5 minute clips that will educate people about the music program. The videos would serve to 1. fundraise 2. educate about music program 3. recruit new students. Mr. Lange requests that he be involved in this and that his groups are represented in the videos. There is consideration of forming a district wide Music Boosters organization to benefit all music programs. There currently is no organization that looks at the future needs of the entire music program. With a new organization a board of representatives from each booster group can make decisions regarding the whole school district music program. All are invited to participate in the formation of this group. If you would like further information about this group you may contact Mr. Lange or Mike Choy for Mr. Jackson's email address.
