






















Band Boosters Endorses Measure A

Davis and Da Vinci High School students excel in many areas. Recent examples include selection of the Jazz Band to compete at the Monterey Next Generation Music Festival, accolades for our choral groups at international music festivals, the recent Robotics Club regional victory propelling them on to national competition, awards in debate and math competitions, recognition of the excellence of the HUB student newspaper, athletic team achievements... the list is long and varied. Excellence at the high school level provides the most visible measure of the quality of a school program, but it demands a strong foundation built in the elementary and junior high schools.

If you have helped your children or grandchildren learn to build block towers, you know that a broad foundation builds a sturdy structure. You also know that pulling out blocks at the base quickly leads to collapse of the whole structure, which can't be repaired by just adding back a few blocks, but requires starting again to rebuild from the bottom up. Failure to pass Measure A may mean cutting back the length of the school day, reducing course offerings, and decreasing educational opportunities at all levels, making it nearly impossible to maintain our strong educational foundation. The negative effects for the music program are particularly obvious, with potential loss of beginning and intermediate band, orchestral and choral instruction, but this is no less true for the other academic endeavors highlighted above.

We are all responsible for providing the best opportunities that we can for the next generation. But even from a self-serving perspective, supporting our schools also benefits our own bottom line. DHS is one of the most highly rated secondary schools in the region, and the entire Davis school system is a positive factor in making Davis a desirable community, fostering business growth and maintaining the value of our investments in home and property.

For all of these reasons, **we urge you to send in a YES vote when the Measure A ballots arrive.** We invite you to join us at the Brunelle Performance Hall for our free Secondary Concert (three junior high bands and DHS Symphonic Band; April 19, 7:30 pm) and the free DHS Jazz Band/Jazz Combo concert (April 17, 7:30 pm) to see for yourself what a strong foundation can build.

The Canada trip is just 6 weeks away and final preparations are underway! Here is the latest Canada news...

Great news! Due to all the fantastic fundraising the group has done this year, the Band Boosters is able to offer a large sum of money to help offset the overall cost of the trip. That contribution, combined with diligent bargaining from the trip committee folks (on everything from busses to hotels to food and activities) has resulted in a lower than expected overall trip cost, even with the recent airline fiasco costs. So the final trip cost per student will be \$750!

Watch for official permission slips and packing information to come home right after Spring Break. There will also be sign ups for parent volunteers for our departure and return day activities - so parents, if you have some time to carpool kids to the airport or to help check kids in for the trip, there will soon be emails looking for volunteers to help with those things.

P.S. You should be very proud of your band student. The DHS Combined Band has been invited to perform at Butchart Gardens this year. The Butchart Gardens coordinator originally told me they have only had high school bands perform there once many summers ago, and it didn't go well at all. They have not had a high school group perform since then, and he was not interested in having our group perform there either. But after reviewing a demo DVD, and after many conversations, the owners of the Gardens decided to give it another try, and they have invited our group to play. It will get lots of publicity through the Festival Society, which promotes the weekend events during the Victoria Day celebration. And best of all, the kids will get complimentary passes to tour the Gardens (which also helped to lower those trip costs! YAY!)

Band Booster Minutes ~ March 9, 2011 A

The meeting was called to order at 7:34 p.m.

I. <u>Approval of Minutes</u> - The minutes from the February meeting as published in the March newsletter with the following corrections (calendar updates to Mr. Lange by March 7, not 17) were approved.



- II. <u>Music Director's Report</u> Mr. Lange reports the kids have been working extremely hard in all groups. Coconut Grove is Sunday night 3/12. The Symphonic Band will be performing a concert with adjudicator Eric Hammer from UOP on Thursday 3/17. On Saturday 3/20 CSUS and DHS Jazz Bands will perform together. Next on 4/1 the Jazz Band heads to Monterey for the Jazz Festival. Band auditions will occur the last week in March. There is a Spring Jazz Band and Combo Concert on 4/17. The 5/28 Combo Concert is cancelled.
- III. <u>Student Report</u> We are still making a decision whether to participate in Picnic Day. We need a viable group and a number of brass players to commit. The Pep Band has been requested to perform at various DHS functions including 4/28 Open House.
- IV. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> Student financial assistance for travel has increased this year, but still seems a reasonable amount. John Horn would like to consider purchases that enhance our sound system. Mr. Lange suggests using funds in the IPAB account to purchase a "snake". After Coconut Grove we'll assess our funding. Last year we allocated \$1000 from the general fund for Jazz Band and \$5000 for the All-Band trip. This year it will be comparable.

V. Committee Reports -

A. Direct Donations (Kathryn) - There were no new donations this month.

B. <u>Coconut Grove</u> (Karen) - All is coming together for this weekend's event. More servers are needed. Mr. Lange will encourage more students to sign up to be servers or bussers. Luci is willing to temporarily store all items after the event. Karen would like people to bring staple guns for set up. Pizza will be provided during set-up.

C. Jazz Band Update (David) - Lynn Rumery is coordinating carpools. Departure on Friday is when the parents want to leave, 3:30 or later. Students and families may attend a concert Friday evening. On Saturday, the band will warm up 1:00 p.m., perform at 1:30, and then sight read at 2:00 p.m. An email for alternative parking was sent to Jazz Band families. There will be a presentation on repetitive stress injuries in band classes on Friday 4/1. Mr. Lange will be taking 101 South. John Horn threatens to beat him there by driving HWY I-5 South.

D. <u>Victoria Spring Trip</u> (Katie) - Students will probably be putting their suitcases on the truck Wednesday and then be taking a small carry-on bag with items for 24 hours with them on the plane. When final decisions on suitcases are made, emails regarding packing advice will be sent out to all. The final trip costs should be well under \$800. Families will be notified of the final cost soon. There are currently 149 people participating. Students can vote on T-shirt designs this week. Info about the trip can be found on Facebook. Students will sign up for room assignments soon.

E. Concerts, CD/DVD Sales (Peggy/Michael) - The 3/20 date is a new concert. John will notify Peggy of the new date.

F. Pizza & Yogurt Fundraisers (Katie) - We had a pizza fundraiser last month that several people attended.

G. <u>Scrip</u> (Lynne) - A SaveMart check for \$100 came in. We have 3 times more people using Scrip than before. A nice letter about the Scrip program was sent to alumni and friends. Lynne wants to continue marketing this program.

VI. New Business -

A. <u>Measure A</u> - Sheila Allen discussed the school parcel tax coming up as a mail-in only ballot in the first week of April. This tax of \$200 for two years will help fund school programs. Please return your ballot by May 3rd. You may hand deliver your ballot at the Yolo County Davis Library. If not passed, class sizes will increase, and 7th period for 7th and 8th graders will be eliminated, which will strangle the band program as students will not be able to take band and another class, like language. It will take a 2/3rds majority of valid ballots that come in to pass. Volunteers needed to participate in phone bank. There is an exemption for senior citizens. DSOMA has endorsed Measure A. DHS Band Boosters voted to unanimously approve Measure A. John Horn suggests posting a statement on the website, and making an announcement on the listserv.

B. Instruments to Victoria - There are nice travel cases for drums in the IPAB to pack percussion for the Victoria Trip. We usually take the old timpani, xylophone, old bells, full drum set, tubas, etc. John will email Mr. Lange to request a complete list of instruments we will take on the trip.

C. <u>Next Year's Calendar</u> - We have a tentative band calendar for 2011-2012 including a possible trip to New Orleans for the Jazz Band during Spring Break in April, 2012 (Weds 4/11 or Thurs 4/12 - Sun 4/15) and the all band trip to San Diego in May 2012. Mr. Lange suggests doing the New Orleans trip with the Jazz Choir.

D. <u>Coconut Grove Decorations Storage</u> - There is some storage available above the instrument cabinets in the back of the band room.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:43 p.m.
