Information

- Campers stay in dormitory cabins, and eat in a central dining hall. Special diet needs can be met with advance notice, and vegetarian meals are always available.
- Each rehearsal/performance site is equipped with a piano, a bass amp and a drum set.
 Drummers need to bring their own cymbals, sticks, brushes and any other special equipment they wish. Two cymbal stands and one high-hat stand are provided. All other instrumentalists must bring their own instrument(s) unless prior arrangements have been made. Vocalists must bring a small cassette tape recorder, or other small recording device.
- Please arrange for campers to arrive in Sacramento (at the airport, bus or train station) before noon at start of camp. They will be met, and transported to camp by STJS volunteers.
- Each camp concludes with a concert in Sacramento. Campers will be bused from the camp to the concert site, and at the conclusion of the performance, approximately 4:00pm, will either be picked up by parents/guardians, or transported to the airport, train, or bus station for travel home.

About Camp



The camp is held at Sly Park, the Sacramento County Office of Education's Outdoor Education Facility, 5600 Sly Park Road, Pollock Pines, California, about an hour east of Sacramento in the beautiful foothills of the Sierra Nevada.

Jazz is America's music, our heritage, and is as much a part of our culture as the automobile. The goal of the STJS Teagarden Trad Jazz Camp is to ensure the survival of our music by "Passing the Torch" from experienced jazz artists to young musicians.

The Camp is focused on improvisation, both individual and group, with an emphasis on turning theory into practice at all times. Students are



assigned to bands with players of similar ability and experience, and perform in a final concert.

There are nightly performances and jam sessions, with both campers and faculty participating. Campers receive semi-private lessons, group instruction, and attend theory classes. There is also time for recreation in the gym, a nature hike or just relaxing.
