**OPPORTUNITY TO OBJECT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT TRINITY RIVER CHANNEL REHABILITATION SITE: DUTCH CREEK USDA FOREST SERVICE SHASTA-TRINITY NATIONAL FOREST**

The Shasta-Trinity National Forest has released an Environmental Assessment and Draft Decision Notice/Finding of No Significant Impact for the Trinity River Channel Rehabilitation Site: Dutch Creek Project ("Project"). The Project proposes to improve habitat along 1.5 miles of the Trinity River for important native anadromous fish. Proposed activities include: placement of a new bend in the river, reduction of riparian encroachment, placement of wood and rock in the channel, physical alteration of alluvial features (e.g., floodplains and side channels), construction of hydraulic structures (wood and log features), and removal/replacement of riparian vegetation at strategic locations. Extensive revegetation of riparian areas with native woody and herbaceous species would also occur.

Project activities would take place on private and public lands, including lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management and the USDA Forest Service, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. The Draft Decision Notice, if finalized, would authorize those activities located on the Shasta-Trinity National Forest within the Big Bar Ranger District (Trinity River Management Unit). This Project is subject to the objection process pursuant to 36 CFR 218, subparts A and B. Objections will only be accepted from those who submitted project-specific written comments during scoping or other designated comment period. Issues raised in objections must be based on previously submitted comments unless based on new information arising after the designated comment period(s).

Objections, including attachments, must be submitted within 45 days following the publication of this legal notice in the Redding Record Searchlight. The date of this legal notice is the exclusive means for calculating the time to file an objection. Those wishing to object should not rely upon dates or timeframes provided by any other source. It is the objector's responsibility to ensure evidence of timely filing such as a postmark, date stamp, or electronic acknowledgment of receipt as outlined in 36 CFR 218.9.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 218.8(d), objections must include the following:

- 1) the objector's name and address, with a telephone number, if available;
  - 2) signature or other verification of authorship (for electronic filings, a scanned signature will suffice);
  - 3) identification of a single lead objector if multiple names are listed on the objection;
  - 4) the name of the proposed project, name and title of responsible official, and the name of the national forest and ranger district on which the proposed project will be implemented;
  - 5) a description of the aspects of the proposed project addressed by the objection, including specific issues related to the proposed project; if applicable, how the objector believes the environmental analysis or draft decision specifically violates law, regulation, or policy; suggested remedies that would resolve the objection; supporting reasons for the reviewing officer to consider; and
  - 6) a statement that demonstrates the connection between prior specific written comments on the particular proposed project or activity and the content of the objection.
  - 7) All documents referenced in the objection must be included in the objection other than those documents at 36 CFR 218.8 which may be incorporated by reference (for example, documents reference in the project EA, previous comments on the project EA, laws, regulations, policies, etc...).
